It's easy to take our health, jobs, and people in our life for granted, we hear it all the time, "appreciate your family, friends and what you have" or "live each day as if it's your last".

We get caught up in the crazy busyness of life, parenting, grand parenting, working, volunteering, so many things to consume our time!

Recently, an incident reminded me, again, how quickly our lives can change.

On my way home from Outreach on one of our late nights when we close at 6, in the misting rain and darkness, I passed an accident that had just happened, only one unmarked car was on scene, his lights flashing to slow traffic.

A car had been rear ended, the trunk was pushed up to the back seat.

As traffic crept by I thought "Boy, that car looks like a friend's of mine", but didn't really think it was, so I kept going. Not 2 miles down the road, my phone rang. My friend, who knew my route, was calling asking for a ride, they had just been in an accident.

After driving back and getting a good look at the car I was shocked. Three doors couldn't be opened, windows were broken, the roof was buckled and the trunk was in the back seat. A sedan being rear ended by a full size pickup going too fast- it was beyond totaled.

Thankfully, there was only one person in the car. Obviously, God had protected the driver. No one should have escaped the car uninjured, in fact, someone could have easily died in the crash. Yet, other than aches and sore muscles, my friend was okay.

At Outreach East, we see people all the time who need our services from being out of work due to a car accident, or illness (cancer is the most common) in their 30's, 40's 50's, struggling to keep their utilities on or put food on the table after a heart attack, or maybe, something seemingly so minor as a broken bone.

So many of us live paycheck to paycheck, (I believe more do than don't) that it doesn't take missing work for very long before we would be financially devastated. And there aren't many resources out there that help people in difficult situations such as these.

Outreach East has helped veterans, area families, seniors, single parent households, grandparents raising grandchildren, aunt's and uncle's raising nieces and nephews, with just over \$50,000 in rent and utility assistance and 150,000 pounds of food in 2017.

Donations you make to Outreach East helps people in your community. Like I've said before, people who need Outreach East's help may sit next to you at church, wait on you at stores, restaurants or gas stations, their children or grandchildren may sit next to yours on the bus or at the lunch table at school.

Our lives can change drastically in a split second. We need to give thanks to God for our loved ones, what we experience and enjoy every day and to be thankful people, helping those in need. It could be our children, grandchildren or us some day.


